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Natick Convene Steering Committee for Golden Triangle Project

Communities Launch Innovative Online Planning Platform for the Region

As we announced in [April](#), these are exciting times for the Golden Triangle, the area near Exit 13 of the MassPike that straddles both Framingham and Natick. The two communities signed a memorandum of agreement in August 2016 to develop together a development plan for this critically important area in MetroWest that is also undergoing transportation planning at the state level.

In the past month, the two communities convened a Steering Committee comprised of representatives from both Framingham and Natick to support the joint effort in the Golden Triangle. The mission of the Steering Committee is to ensure that the Golden Triangle study includes:

- A clear, achievable, and shared development vision for the area, along with zoning recommendations and an action plan;
- Input to the Massachusetts Department of Transportation (MassDOT) that will help the state improve Exit 13 access in a way that supports the shared development vision;
- Feasible development options for the region;
- Development options to advance the area's quality of life.

The 8000-square foot building has two floors, a drive up window and drive up ATM. When you enter the building, you will find that no detail was overlooked as we planned it out. It has a lot of natural light, clean lines, variety of textures and plenty of imagery from local businesses and organizations.

Since we are focused on innovation, you'll find that we have not skimped on technology in the branch, which includes our tech bar "Avid Ideas Lab," touch screen televisions, social media wall, digital bulletin boards for community events, a coin machine, and more.

Outside of the branch, you'll find nice courtyards, landscaping and a sculpture created by an artist from New Hampshire.

Steering Committee participants not only include local officials from each of the communities, but also representatives from major employers and civic organizations in and around the Golden Triangle.

Soccer Camp Collaboration Between Alira Health and SMOC Brings Italy to Framingham



From July 10 - 14, 85 boys and girls between the ages 5 and 12 who are a part of summer programs offered by the [South Middlesex Opportunity Council](#) (SMOC), their congregate shelters

and the [Suburban Athletic Club](#), had the unique opportunity to participate in a free soccer clinic, where they learned from professional players and expert coaches. The clinic was the result of a collaboration between SMOC and Framingham's Alira Health.

Local [Alira Health](#) CEO Gabriel Brambilla approached SMOC's Executive Director Jim Cuddy earlier this year, looking for a way to get involved in the community after expanding his company in Framingham last year. Brambilla proposed a soccer camp for the kids, offering to bring soccer players from Italy over to assist and help coach for the week.

Paulo Taddei and Pierpaolo Tugliola both have played and coached soccer in Italy, and they brought their expertise and love of soccer to the camp. They were joined by other local volunteers and coaches to bring the camp together and give the 85 children the opportunity to learn from a variety of expert coaches. Each day, the kids learned new practice drills, participated in pick-up games, and ended the day with team scrimmages. At the end of the week, the kids had all come together as a group to support and learn from one another.

"This is a great example showing that, in Framingham, leaders can connect and make an immediate impact," said Arthur Robert, Director of Community and Economic Development. "Collaborative community service projects like these highlight the very best Framingham has to offer."

The SMOC team and Mr. Brambilla are looking forward to doing it all again next year.
