The Framingham Public Library provides free information and services that promote lifelong learning and personal enrichment, encouraging and contributing to the civic, intellectual and cultural pursuits of the community.

All are welcome to visit the 57,000 square-foot Main Library in downtown Framingham, containing a vast array of resources, or to stop by the busy McAuliffe Branch Library, where personalized service makes it a favorite for people of all ages.

Almost 50% of Framingham residents hold a library card that provides them access to almost 294,000 items, including magazines, books, ebooks, and audiovisual materials.

The Library is also a member of the Minuteman Library System, a cooperative network and delivery system that provides additional access to the collections of 354 public and academic libraries.

Last year, library users checked out 800,000 items from the two library branches and received answers to over 47,000 reference questions.



In addition, approximately 40,000 people had the opportunity to attend 1,800 free programs, from preschool stories hours to author visits; from music performances and film series to fall and spring lecture series presented in collaboration with Framingham State University.



These and other programs have made the Framingham Public Library a popular destination, and a resource truly deserving to be recognized as one of the key centers of our community.

In 2019, the Library expanded its reach to more residents by adding a Bookmobile. The Bookmobile is a library on wheels, equipped with technology, programming, books, movies, music and more. The Bookmobile can be found visiting schools, senior centers, homebound patrons, and more.
