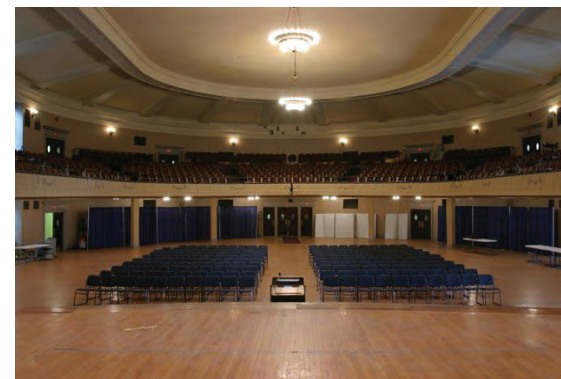

Nevins Hall - Up to 1,800 seats; flat floor; suitable for performances or events; located in the Memorial Building, which serves as the city's municipal offices.

Cushing Chapel - Built in 1943-1944 as part of the Cushing General Hospital.

Village Hall - Built in 1834 in historic Framingham Centre, this beautiful space faces the Framingham Common and is often used for weddings and parties.
